# Report of the President & Executive Director

Two years ago, when I began my term as President, it seemed like two years would be a long time, but it has flown by as the Board, Committees and Staff worked together to strengthen and build our United Way. As we have reviewed our history and our community's economics we have come to realize that what we thought was a short economic downturn has become, in many ways, the new reality. For several years, we have worked hard to maintain a consistent \$1.4 million Campaign as the economy changed and donor's needs changed. During the last two years two individual donors pulled us along on that changing path with significant designated gifts. Although we have always received estate gifts, they have generally been only a portion of the estate, this year a very generous donor left his entire estate to the United Way. He designated that it be used for substance abuse treatment and prevention. Another donor looked around at the people she encountered every day and said, "The United Way dental clinic does great work but let's take it a step further and make sure there is funding available to enhance a smile, improve self confidence and thereby increase the opportunity for getting a job". Two new funds were established and are already working to meet those donors' wishes in our community. The United Way of St. Clair County has always been about meeting the needs of donors and the community. It is obvious that our commitment to donors and our reputation of accountability will continue to push us to develop new avenues of service and perhaps even more specialized funds.

In looking to the future I believe it is important for all of us to understand these changes in donor needs and also, that we face increased competition for dollars. While we have a very generous community, budgets are tighter and expanded technology provides donors with choices for giving that have greatly increased. Our Campaign Team members need the support of all United Way volunteers and funded organizations to keep reiterating to everyone we know that United Way is committed to dollars staying **local and accountable**. That funding is not done on an entitlement basis but to meet the needs of both the donor and the community.

As Executive Director this year has been one of change and visioning. Two members of the staff have taken partial retirements, both Susan and Jan have become part time employees. Dan joined the staff eager to use his knowledge and connections to Organized Labor to build the Campaign. Doug joined the staff as a committed donor and an experienced community leader whose vision is to take time to give back to the community. The changes in staffing have allowed employees with high levels of experience to stay involved while adding those with new enthusiasm to spur the Campaign on. In closing, both Jo Ann and I, want

to express great appreciation for the trust that has been placed in us to lead this organization and to be a part of the wonderful family of United Way of St. Clair County.

# Citizens Review Committee Report

This year, with the electronic application process fully operational, the Citizens Review Committee (CRC) moved forward identifying and addressing opportunities to enhance the community. Over the course of the last decade our community has experienced considerable economic change. The recommendations of the CRC during this period were focused on providing for the most basic human needs. It now appears that the economy has stabilized and that in order to make lasting improvement it is time to give attention to changing the root causes of our community's problems. While the CRC will always prioritize basic needs, a singular focus in this area will not change the future. This redirection can be seen in the titles of the new IMPACT Areas, each title sets the challenge for organizations seeking funding to provide programs that meet immediate needs but also develop skills toward self-sufficiency.

This year we began a process to identify and fund pilot programs that have the potential to change the future. The CRC members believe that for adults; how to get and keep a job requires new skills, so funding was provided for a program with Baker College. Youth need to learn how to manage finances, so a program at Blue Water Community Action was funded. The results have proven successful; jobs have been found, savings accounts have been established. It will take small steps over a long period of time to make lasting change but the CRC is committed to doing just that. Every member of the CRC is a donor and any donor that is willing to work hard and is committed to making our community a better place to live is welcome to join.






