

Who Is ALICE?

ALICE is an acronym for **A**sset **L**imited, **I**ncome **C**onstrained, **E**mployed.

It is a way of defining and understanding households that earn above the Federal Poverty Level and still struggle to afford a basic necessities household budget. These households are one unexpected expense or emergency away from financial crisis.

How has the number of struggling households changed over time?

"The number of households below the ALICE Threshold fluctuates throughout the year. Households move in and out of poverty and ALICE as their circumstances worsen or improve. The general trend has been a flat recovery since 2010, the end of the Great Recession. In many locations, the cost of basics has increased more than wages, leading to an increase in the number of ALICE households."

HOW OUR SUPPORTED PROGRAMS ARE BRIDGING THE GAP TO HELP THOSE IN NEED

Comprehensive Youth Services, Inc.

In 2018, 90-day follow-up results of the Wings of the Harbor program showed success rates as follows: Out of 14 youth, 100% enrolled in school, graduated, obtained a GED, or are enrolled in skills training; 95% remain in safe stable housing; 100% have at least 1 healthy, caring, positive relationship with an adult other than TLP staff.

The Harbor provided services to 92 youth throughout 2018 with 96% (88) of the youth served exited to safe, secure housing. Of the 92 youths served, 86 of them returned home while 2 of them went to the Wings program. 98% (90) youths improved in the school, benefited from the educational program, and completed their schoolwork.

Helping Hands Ministries

Blue Water Area Rescue Mission served a total of 266 different individuals in 2018. This equates to a total of 9,605 bed nights and an average of 17 people per night.

Hunter Hospitality House

In 2018, HHH hosted 273 guests, giving them a total of 1,480 days of free lodging. Twenty-nine of those guests were from St. Clair County, and 27% of the guests stayed at HHH because of patients from St. Clair County.

Sanborn Gratiot Memorial Home

17,520 hours of subsidized assisted living care was provided at Sanborn Gratiot Memorial Home in 2018 to seniors who were low income and could not afford the full cost of care.

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
