Presenting Campaign Sponsor

United Way embodies the spirit of living united within the community. Last year, United Way 211 answered more that 3,514 phone calls, connecting residents of St. Clair County to essential community resources. In our county, over 10,000 people have used a program or service that is funded by **United Way.** These are often hardworking members of the community, facing difficult times. The need within the community is significant, but with continued support, there is hope for a brighter future!

Due, in part, to your generous contributions to the United Way of St. Clair County last year:

- 69,300,000 dollars raised for essential services since 1924.
- The United Way of St. Clair County provided \$60,000 of Emergency Housing funding to Blue Water Community Action Agency.
- The United Way of St. Clair County provided \$60,000 of Utility Assistance funding to Blue Water Community Action Agency. 203 households in St. Clair County received assistance equaling \$295.57 each, per household.
- 4,353 youth in St. Clair County Imagination Library between the ages 0 5 receive a free ageappropriate book delivered to their mailbox each month. The total number of books distributed since the program began is over 600,000. United Way provides funding for the at-risk population.
- The United Way Medical Loan Closet had 720 visits for durable and disposable medical supplies.
- 350 survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault and elder abuse were kept safe from their offender last year while Blue Water Safe Horizons Carolyn's Place Shelter.
- 76 young people found stability and support for their education at **The Harbor**, a shelter for runaway and homeless youth.
- Through Visiting Nurse Association 139 seniors received Special Care Services, Hospice Services or Personal Emergency Response System Program Services.
- 306 persons of disability received Advocacy services from the ARC of St. Clair County.
- 291 St. Clair County residents received peer support recovery services through BWROC.
